<sup>i</sup>This column contains the geographical coordinates (latitude/longitude) of the location, if there is any. In order to avoid unnecessary use of non-standard characters and space, the following standard presentation is used:

**0000***lat* **00000***long* (*lat* - Latitude: N or S ; *long* – Longitude: W or E, only one digit, capital letter)

Where the last two rightmost digits refer to minutes and the first two or three digits refer to the degrees for latitude and longitude respectively. In addition, you must specify N or S for latitude and W or E for longitude, as appropriate.
